***“1. Joseph found himself in a strange land with a strange language he did not understand; he had several challenges which could prevent him from succeeding. ## HAVING WHAT IT TAKES TO SUCCEED

1. **The fear of God:** Joseph was God fearing and he refused to compromise his faith in God. In 2011 the devil will try to entice us with certain things to lure us to compromise our faith in God. Remember the title of the devil has not changed, he is still the father of lies and his modus operandi has not changed. He will always throw things at us as a decoy to deceive us to do the wrong things.

2. **Good Morals:** We must always try to maintain very high morals, we will not always have a clean slate, but as soon as we realize that we have broken the rules, we must quickly to go God and plead for His forgiveness and realign ourselves once again to the proper order.

3. **Methods:** Your methods are your road map to your destination. A goal without a plan is like a road leading to nowhere. You must set the goal first, then the plan and then the process. You will not get everything right from the beginning, but continue systematically, don't jump in the middle of your dream but keep the process going.

4. **Walking in Absolute obedience:** As we walk in obedience, God will make His provision available to us. He is looking for people who stand for the truth and live by it. Joseph purposed in his heart that he would not compromise his faith in God. He was humiliated, but in the end God elevated him. God made His provision available to him as a reward of obedience.
