



A Great Door is Opened

“For a great door and effectual is opened unto me, and there are many adversaries” (1 Corinthians 16:9).

The 13th chapter of the book of Exodus includes some of the story regarding the deliverance of God's people out of the land of bondage. In the 17th verse of this chapter we read that God couldn't even take His people out by using the short route. He was forced to take them down a much longer road. Why? According to the Bible, it was because they would have rather went back into to bondage than to face their opposition. Sound familiar?

I am growing daily in the things of the Lord and His Word is changing the way I think, the way I feel and the way I make my choices.

Today I will speak life and not death into every situation of my life and I will not experience death but live to demonstrate His goodness.

I double-dog-dare you to speak this over yourself for the next 30 days straight. If you miss a day - start all over again! Don't cheat and don't lie. Go to work and climb to a brand new level and REFUSE to back down. You'll see some wonderful changes occur in every arena of your life!
